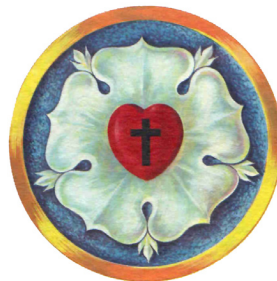
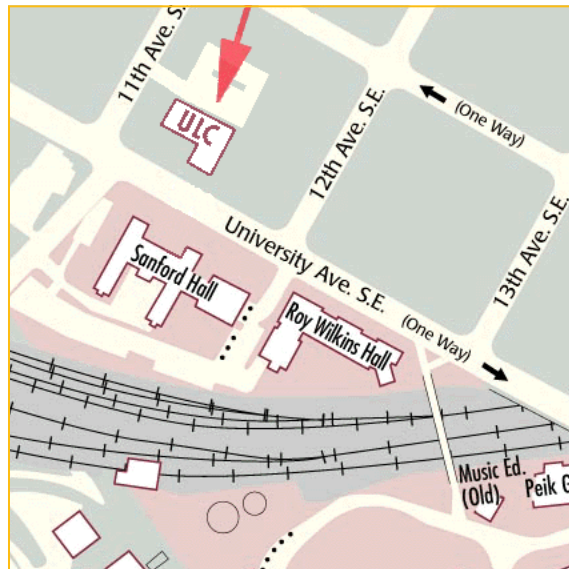
Directions

Speaker

Rev. Todd Peperkorn is pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church in Kenosha, Wisconsin. He is a 1992 graduate of Concordia, Seward (B.A.) and a 1996 (M.Div.) and 1999 (S.T.M.) graduate of Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Rev. Peperkorn has been the speaker at various linkages, regional pastor conferences, the St. Michael Liturgical Conference, Higher Things, and other free conferences. He was the founding editor of Higher Things Magazine, has contributed to various scholarly journals such as CTQ and Logia, and is the author of the book, *I Trust When Dark My Road: A Lutheran View of Depression*. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the South Wisconsin District of the LCMS. Rev. Peperkorn has been married to his wife, Kathryn, for fourteen years. They have four children.



Topic

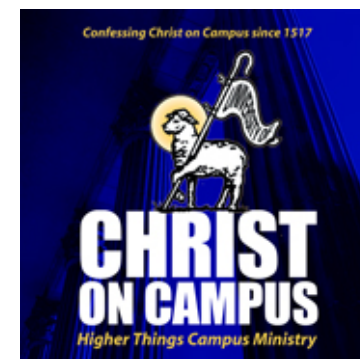
